

Elders Meeting Minutes June 19, 2023

The June Elder's meeting was called to order with the following elders present: Harry Harris, Harv Buckner and Roger Brown. Presenters in attendance: the Preaching Minister, Butch Gastfield, Church Administrator, Chris Callahan and Chairman of the Deacons, Michael Bolter.

Harv presented the opening meditation and prayer.

The May minutes were accepted and approved.

Michael presented the Deacon's report. He described a new learning and sharing program entitled "Are You Fishing" designed to continue to mature the deacons on their personal discipleship pathway. He discussed the monthly schedules for the next six months and addressed the support given to the latest Women's Ministry event. A review of lockup procedures was the subject of the deacon's training event this month. Among other topics of interest, Michael closed with a discussion of the process for requesting support from the deacons. Clarification of this process will be provided.

The Administrative report was presented by Chris. The May financial report was approved after the overview was completed. Chris shared that our communications partner has made significant improvements for our webpage and encouraged everyone to review and provide feedback. Chris mentioned that the Building Leadership Team will meet with the contractor team this coming week to finalize the conceptual approach given the budget we have to work with as a result of the FORWARD campaign. He envisions a presentation to the Elders in July. Harv mentioned that The Villages has approved our request for updating our signs facing Route 466 and initiation of the contracting effort will commence about mid-July. Bob Marshall has played a critical role in accomplishing the successful conclusion of this complex initiative. With the summer resident reduction in full swing, average worship attendance for the month of May was 738 (including average on-line of 73).

The Preaching Minister's Report was presented by Butch. He shared the plans for continued revision of the basic five discipleship training classes to include a further streamlining of the PLACE class. He also discussed his involvement with the leaders of the Men's Ministry. Jerry Benware has an active team working on plans for the year and they are meeting monthly with Butch. He also discussed the growing number of new members and baptisms conducted this month. The ministry staff and the church leadership continue to communicate well and work together to advance the growth of our members along their discipleship pathway. The ministers will be planning one-day offsite, on the last Tuesday of June. Butch presented the Associate Ministers' reports covering their activities for the month of

May/June.

Under Old Business, final updates to the Church Policies and Procedures are underway and should be ready for review before the end of June. Also addressed was the status of the update by the Missions Committee on policies related to mission trips. Harv stated this was in process.

Chris closed the meeting with prayer.

The next monthly Elders meeting is scheduled for July 17th.

I love Fairway! Fairway is different from most successful churches in America due to its unique demographic. According to church growth experts, a church like Fairway should never work. But it does work, beautifully, because of God. God is not limited by the short-sighted view of man or the statistics that man creates. What a joy that we don't struggle with the age discrimination that is so rampant in churches around the country.

Think about this: Unless Jesus returns soon, one out of one will die. Even though we appear to be about the same age, Fairway will gradually grow younger while simultaneously maintaining our folks who are living longer. With that consideration, how will our programming look? How will our Worship look? How will our needs change?

My demographic (55-65) is moving to the Villages at an alarming rate. Working from home allows those who have not yet retired to enjoy a semi-retired lifestyle. My point (and I do have one) is this: Fairway must continue to expand the Gospel message while meeting the relevant needs of those moving into our community and those who continue to live and serve here. It's a big job, but God can do it if we make ourselves available to Him.

Mary, the young, future mother of Jesus, recognized the extent of the Gospel when she said, "for He who is mighty has done great things for me, and holy is His name. And His mercy is for those who fear Him from generation to generation (Luke 1:49-50). Fairway will continue to grow and change as long as we put God first.

Remember when we launched the FORWARD Initiative this past February? The elders and ministry staff were so excited that so many enthusiastically embraced the vision presented earlier that previous year centering on more intentional disciple-making. That vision included expanding our facility to accommodate future growth and ministry opportunities and the planting of a new family church in or near the new Middleton community being built south of the turnpike.

So many of you embraced the FORWARD Initiative designed to fund the vision! At the conclusion of our FORWARD Initiative on the weekend of March 12th, do you recall what was committed? We established a "Challenge" Goal of \$1.5 million dollars and a "Dream" goal of \$3.0 million dollars and Fairway, proving to be the generous church she has always been, along with her friends, committed \$3.8 million dollars! Wow! Double wow! God is good!

This month we're coming up on the three-month mark into this 25-month initiative, and it seems God is moving powerfully to help people remain faithful to their commitments! That means less money to borrow when building begins which translates into more opportunities to fund ministry to reach people in order to make more disciples!

Thanks so much Fairway! You know, when we are generous with our resources, God blesses! Did you know that in 2 Corinthians 8:6, Paul calls giving an "act of grace" and then urges the Corinthian church to "excel in this act of grace?" Well, let me tell you – Fairway Christian Church is also a church that "excels at this "act of grace!" Grace is all about giving – just like God gave to us! I get excited thinking about the opportunities that lie ahead for Fairway to be a premier disciple-making church in The Villages! And to be the kind of church that embraces the vision of reaching more people and making more disciples through church planting! Keep up the great work Fairway!

By the way, just a note: The 501 (c)(3) Dads for a Day, Inc. ministry that Fairway helped birth and has financially supported since its inception seven years ago has been terminated. No further financial support is needed. Thank you to all who gave and all who volunteered to make a difference in the lives of the fatherless young men who benefitted from the program.
