



Elder Meeting Minutes

JULY 21, 2025

The July Elder's meeting was called to order with the following elders present: Harry Harris, Roger Brown, Jerry Benware, and Paul Cook. Presenters attending: Preaching Minister, Butch Gastfield; Chairman of the Deacons, Michael Bolter; and Church Administrator, Chris Callahan.

Chris presented the meditation and opening prayer.

The June minutes were accepted and approved.

Michael presented the Deacon's report. Michael shared that the deacons are excited about the additional and expanded responsibilities they will face as we open the new parts of the church.

In light of this, we will need to build and enhance our hospitality teams to cover all doors for all the services. Also, the parking lot ministry will need to grow as well. Michael shared that the Deacan's handbook has been updated and distributed. He noted that Tom Ross provided an update on the Emergency Response Team and more volunteers are stepping up to help. Advertising for that team will be posted in upcoming newsletters and the bulletin to help our congregation know the team is available at each of our services. Michael said that support for the Women's luncheons are covered for the next several months. In closing, he noted that the Men's breakfast was well attended in July.

Chris presented the administrative report. The June financial reports were reviewed and approved. Chris provided details regarding the status of our Forward campaign, Phases one and two. Chris reviewed the financial status of our church plant, Unity Christian Church and stated that they now have the capability to independently manage their funds, which is a great step forward in the development of the church. Chris provided the latest schedule for paving of our parking lot and the date of the "soft opening," August 17th, with the Grand Opening scheduled for September 28th. He stated that we are working on a video for Butch to use in the services that will show the congregation the new layout of the parking lot and the building one week prior to the opening of the facility. We are still on track to complete the major portions of the contract by the end of July, but some construction may continue a bit past this date. He reminded us that our owners portion of interior decorating and furniture arrangement will then commence.

The Preaching Minister's Report was provided by Butch. He is working on numerous projects in support of our wall murals slated to be applied during the months of August/September. He continues to hold meetings with leaders involved in the church plant as well as with local ministers in our fellowship. We had several baptisms, memorial services, and a baby dedication during the month of July in addition to many ministry support actions. Butch continues working with the ministry staff on training, teaching and fellowship opportunities slated to start in the fall, in addition to the many special events we have slated for the next two months leading to the Grand Opening. The associate ministers' reports reflected on the development of educational materials, training for teachers and organizing for new discipleship groups to be ready in late August for early September start. The choir music for the year, choir specials, Christmas Musical, and Easter Musical, 2026 have been decided upon and are ready to be put into practice at the appropriate dates.

A number of home visits, church plant visits, hospital calls, telephone contacts bereavement visits and office appointments were completed by the ministerial staff in addition to Grief Share Sessions and Sunday morning Bible studies. Our ministers remain among the busiest and most caring people in the community. We are blessed to have them.

Under Old Business, Harry noted that our Minister/Elder coordination meeting will be held on August 5th. The elders discussed details regarding outside ministries to ensure those that are being supported are still in line with the policies and practices of FCC. The church directory update is in progress and a report is expected in early August. Butch presented alternatives to our "invitation" process, and we are evaluating this with the possibility of making some changes.

Under New Business, the Elders set up a schedule for the Saturday services so that an Elder would be present at these services. Reaction time to requests made on the Connection Cards and Ministry Interest Forms was discussed with the goal of ensuring quick and accurate response and/or action.

Jerry provided the closing prayer.

The next monthly Elders meeting is scheduled for August 18th.

Below is a picture from a Gastfield family vacation that took place in 1971. We were living in England. I would have been 11 years old. My Dad was stationed at Woodbridge/ Bentwaters AFB (about 70 miles NE of London) while serving

out his last three years of a 20-year Air Force career. We took a vacation to Scotland in the little English Ford Anglia shown in the picture. Four kids in the back seat, Mom in the front passenger seat with a new dachshund puppy in between her feet and the spare tire under her feet! This was supposed to be an enjoyable camping trip up into Scotland and back home to Bentwaters AFB in a week and a half. I was going to suggest that - but given the murmuring and visible signs of stress Dad was exhibiting while he worked on the stove, I decided the smart thing to do was leave Dad alone at the moment and hide in the tent with my brothers and sister until dinner was served. Not only did we all go to bed hungry that night – it was the first and last night in a tent the entire vacation.

You see that night in their tent, Mom and Dad must have had a secret meeting and decided to change things up and take advantage of what the English called a "Bed & Breakfast".
